- Two new rescues (Zakai and Takoda) were welcomed at W.O.L.F. Both will receive lifelong care in a natural habitat setting at our facility.
- We sadly report the passing of three of our wolf dogs (Rajan, Tonka and Kaileah), the eldest being 16 years old.
- W.O.L.F. assisted in rescue alerts and logistics for 250 wolves and wolf dogs in need of new homes.
- Continuation as an accredited member of the American Sanctuary Association, CO Parks and Wildlife, PACFA, and USDA.
- Continuation as a coalition member of the Rocky Mountain Wolf Project, working to reintroduce wolves to the Rockies.



Our youngest rescue, Zakai, joined W.O.L.F. in August 2018.

EDUCATION & COMMUNICATIONS



- Presented 29 educational programs to over I,694 schoolchildren and adults across the Front Range. Programs included wild wolf biology, behavior and ecology, wolf dog challenges, and the captive wildlife crisis.
- Responded to roughly 8,500 email inquiries and 2,200 phone calls relevant to 276 requests for wolf and wolf dog rescue assistance.
- Attended 13 public tabling events across the northern Front Range showcasing our educational materials to thousands.
- Distributed over 9,000 educational newsletters throughout the U.S. and abroad. Kept more than 6,880 supporters informed through monthly e-newsletters.
- Over 270,000 followers on Facebook and 275,000 likes. Increased Instagram following by 400 followers, total of 12.2K.

2018 ANNUAL GALA

Our 2018 gala raised net \$113,000+ towards W.O.L.F. operational costs and property improvements at Red Feather Lakes.

The gala hosted over **325+ attendees** and offered plated vegan and vegetarian dishes, in addition to a live hula performance for guests. Silent and live auction items, such as adopting a Guardian Angels and a trip to Yellowstone with biologists from Yellowstone Wolf Tracker were just a few of the main highlights of the evening.

Guest speakers included famous wolf biologist, Rick McIntyre, who spent more than 24 years in Yellowstone National Park overseeing the wolf population and the ecosystem they reside

In addition, author Nate Blakeslee of New York Times Best Seller American Wolf attended the Gala to share insight around his experiences centric to the famous Yellowstone wolf, O-Six, a charismatic alpha female beloved by park rangers and amateur spotters alike. Nate also signed books for supporters.

COLORADO GIVES DAY

On December 4, 2018, W.O.L.F. participated in Colorado Gives Day, sponsored by Community First Foundation and FirstBank. The program offers a portion of the \$1 million incentive fund to Colorado nonprofits, increasing the value of every dollar donated.

Our goal was to raise \$100,000 for operational expenses and for property improvements at our new location near Red Feather Lakes. Results shared that we exceeded our goal, raising \$177,297 with the matching program and the generous support of our donors, inclusive of two special \$50,000 donations.
