RESCUE & SANCTUARY

- Four new rescues (Kovu, Yuki, Kieran, Mayari) were welcomed at W.O.L.F. All will receive lifelong care in a natural habitat setting at our facility.
- We sadly report the passing of four of our wolf dogs (Skye, Denall, Ahote, Bella-Roux), the eldest being 16 years old.
- W.O.L.F. assisted in rescue alerts and logistics for 100+ wolves and wolf dogs in need of new homes.
- Continuation as an accredited member of the American Sanctuary Association, PACFA, and USDA. Received Better Business accreditation in Q3.
- Continuation as a coalition member of the Rocky Mountain Wolf Project, working to reintroduce wolves to the Rockies.



Our youngest rescue, Kieran, joined W.O.L.F. in May 2020.

EDUCATION & COMMUNICATIONS



- Presented 5 educational programs to over 415 schoolchildren and adults across the Front Range. Programs included wild wolf biology, behavior and ecology, wolf dog challenges, and the captive wildlife crisis.
- W.O.L.F. received 302 requests for assistance to help save wolf dogs as well as requests to help with two major rescues involving over 75 animals in Texas and Michigan.
- Attended 5 public tabling events across the northern Front Range showcasing our educational materials to thousands.
- Distributed over 9,000 educational newsletters throughout the U.S. and abroad. Kept more than 7,200 supporters informed through monthly e-newsletters.
- Over 269,000 followers on Facebook and 272,000 likes. Increased Instagram following to 27,300 followers to date.

2020 ANNUAL GALA — Gone Virtual!

In light of the global pandemic COVID-19, our 2020 gala raised net \$120,000+ towards W.O.L.F. operational costs and property improvements at Red Feather Lakes.

Themed Snow Ball Masque-Fur-Aid, the virtual gala hosted over 200+ attendees and was streamed live in Fort Collins, CO. Silent and live auction items, such as becoming an animal's Guardian Angel and a trip to Yellowstone with legendary wolf biologist Rick McIntyre, were just a few of the main highlights of the evening.

Guest speaker included famous wolf biologist, Rick McIntyre, who spent more than 24 years in Yellowstone National Park overseeing the wolf population. Rick shared insights from his recently published book, The Rise of Wolf 8, and also engaged in a Q&A session with audience members through pre-submitted questions.

Due to the challenging fire activity impacting safety surrounding the vicinity of both of W.O.L.F's property locations in Rist Canyon and Red Feather Lakes Colorado, the wolf dogs were evacuated twice to The Wild Animal Sanctuary (TWAS) in Keensburg.

W.O.L.F. successfully raised the funds for a pre-loved evacuation truck, two new trailers, and crates for the wolf dogs thanks to the support of the public to help enable the Sanctuary to be self-sufficient for upcoming challenges in the future.

COLORADO GIVES DAY

On December 8, 2020, W.O.L.F. participated in Colorado Gives Day, sponsored by Community First Foundation and FirstBank. The program offers a portion of the \$1 million incentive fund to Colorado nonprofits, increasing the value of every dollar donated.

Our goal was to raise \$50,000 for operational expenses and for property improvements at our new location near Red Feather Lakes. Results shared that we exceeded our goal, raising \$100,000 with the matching program and the generous support of our donors.
