Letter from the Director

Dear W.O.L.F. Friends and Supporters:

Happy New Year to all of you! As we enter 2022, we are excited to share with you an update on our vision for the year and the progress that has been made at our new future home at Red Feather Lakes.

We have been busy preparing for the four-legged residents' arrival at their new forever home thanks to the support of our talented and dedicated contractors, SA Miro and Black Eagle Fencing. The fencing for the animals' habitats is finished and approved by the County. We need to install dig guards. Additionally, we plan to include deck pens within the habitats, build holders for feeder bowls, and build solar-powered heated water bowls for Colorado winters. Our internal road system is almost complete as we are waiting on the final approval from the County, and we have finished the installation of a well on the property. The designs for our meat storage and processing building are in its final stages of completion. Below is a visual featuring the conceptual design for your reference, which we couldn't be prouder of! We still have more to do, but we on target to relocating the wolf dogs to Red Feather Lakes by the end of 2022.

On another exciting note, this Spring we are hosting our annual fundraising gala at the Hilton, Fort Collins, on April 9th, themed "A Furry Tail". The event will help us raise funds for the animals within our care and for their new home at Red Feather Lakes. Our VIP speaker and guest, Suzanne Asha Stone, will be joining us during the evening to discuss dispelling the myth of the "big, bad, wolf" and provide our supporters with actions they can take to protect the future of wolves in the Northern Rockies region. Wolves Need Our Help <u>NOW</u>



This month marked an incredible initiative thanks to the research, science and voices advocating for wolves across the nation— Colorado wolves are back on the federal endangered list, along with all gray wolves in the lower 48 states.

While this is incredible news, **we need to continue to be a voice for wolves in the Northern Rockies** region who need an emergency relisting so we can protect ALL wolves across the nation.

The states of Idaho, Montana, Wyoming, eastern Washington, eastern Oregon, and northeastern Utah are still facing extreme challenges since their delisting from the Endangered Species Act years ago. Because of the delisting, wolves have been misappropriately managed by each state's fish and wildlife department and by legislators passing wolf management bills. The approaches concocted over the years to manage by killing shares with the world a glimpse of what the future will be for wolves, or lack thereof.

Montana and Idaho have adopted aggressive "wolf management" practices, allowing the killing of 85% to 90% statewide. Unethical management practices include the implementation of snares, traps, night hunting, baiting and bounties.

As we speak, Idaho is allowing the killing of newborn pups and nursing mothers in their dens, and Montana is allowing hunters to bait wolves from Yellowstone and kill them once their paws cross the invisible boundary of the park. Already, over 24 members of Yellowstone's iconic wolf packs have been killed. The Phantom Lake pack has lost so many members that park officials have declared it "eliminated." In fact, bounties of up to \$2,500 are being paid in the states of Idaho and Montana to incentivize the killing of wolves. Did you know that lucrative bounties such as this are not offered on any other species anywhere in the US?

We need your help **NOW** to put a stop to the barbaric killing of wolves in the Rockies. Many of our supporters ask how they can help. Follow the steps below on how you can be a voice for a species that needs us more now than ever.

1. You can send in your comments to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services and encourage an emergency re-listing of gray wolves — *https://www.regulations.gov/commenton/FWS-HQ-ES-2021-0106-0001*.

Suzanne Asha Stone has been on the front lines of wolf restoration in the Western USA since 1988. She began as an intern for the US Fish and Wildlife Service, USDA Forest Service, and Nez Perce Tribe's Central Idaho interagency wolf recovery steering committee. There she coordinated reports of wolf sightings around the state and helped the search to document wolves in the wild places of Idaho. After graduation, Suzanne served on the Central Idaho and Yellowstone wolf reintroduction teams in the mid-1990s, caring for the wolves awaiting transport in northern British Columbia and releasing them in central Idaho. In 1999, she was recruited by Defenders of Wildlife as their Idaho based wolf conservationist covering wolf conservation across much of the West from the Rockies to the Pacific Northwest and California. Often her work placed her at the heart of the sociopolitical war over the return of the wolf where she recognized that wolves would never escape human persecution until people found a way to live in peace with them.

Suzanne holds a Wildlife Conservation and Conflict Management Master's Degree from Prescott College. She founded the Wood River Wolf Project in 2008 to demonstrate that wolves can coexist with sheep operations on national forests when ad-



conflict in Idaho. She has spoken at conferences and events around the world including the Smithsonian Institute, Oxford University, the United Nations Conference on Biodiversity, and more.

Suzanne is now the Executive Director of the International Wildlife Coexistence Network where she is now helping to protect wolves and other imperiled wildlife with communities around the world.
